DR. BR AMBEDKAR

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar (1891-1956) was a jurist, economist, and social reformer who fought for Dalit rights and social justice. As the chief architect of the Indian Constitution and India's first Law Minister. ensured he fundamental rights and equality for all. A scholar with doctorates from Columbia University and LSE, he advocated for education. labour rights, and gender equality. In 1956, he embraced Buddhism, inspiring a mass movement. His legacy remains a cornerstone India's democratic values.
